He advocated for age-inclusive policies with psychological safety, ergonomic interventions, physical health promotion, and age-specific health checks as workplace mandates. Dr. Gautham Melur Sukumar, Professor from the Department of Public Health, NIMHANS, stressed the need to align workplace mental health programs with national public health priorities to build healthier, more resilient workforces.

Dr. Suhas Chakraborthy, Medical Superintendent at HAL, reinforced that mental health is essential for business success and must be a core organisational priority to support employee well-being.

The workshop concluded with a clear message: Companies must be future-ready with integrated mental health support, preventive care, and age-friendly policies to build healthy, productive, and inclusive workplaces.
